LEOPARD GECKO #1

You can't do that!

ELEPHANT

Who are you?

LEOPARD GECKO #2

We're Leopard Geckos.

LEOPARD GECKO #1

We escaped with you. Remember?

ELEPHANT

We ESCAPED?

KINGSNAKE

(to GECKO)

What do you mean, we can't settle down here?

LEOPARD GECKO #3

You have to find your right biome.

BEETLE

Biome?

LEOPARD GECKO #3

Sure! The right habitat for your species— what you're adapted to.

LEOPARD GECKO #2

Take us Geckos. We're adapted to the deserts of central Asia.

LEOPARD GECKO #1

And we've adapted a great way to escape desert predators!

LEOPARD GECKO #2

When someone grabs our tail, it falls right off so we can escape. Then it grows back later!

LEOPARD GECKO #3

You need to find the right biome for each of you.

GO FIND YOUR PLACE

(STARFISH enter. THE TRIO see the STARFISH.)

BEETLE

Hey, look in that tide pool. Who are you?

STARFISH #1

We're starfish, also called sea stars.

STARFISH #2

We live in the marine biome.

STARFISH #3

It's the largest ecosystem.

KINGSNAKE

You think any of US belong here?

(STARFISH look them over very carefully.)

STARFISH #1

I don't think so. At least not here in the tide pool.

STARFISH #2

But the ocean has a lot of different zones— estuaries, the open sea, the deep ocean.

STARFISH #3

There's a lot of strange stuff out there—we're sticking right here, close to shore.

CLOSE TO SHORE

'CAUSE OUT IN THESE WATERS THERE'RE FLOATING SEA OTTERS THE WHALE AND DOLPHIN AND SHARK

AND DEEP IN THE OCEAN
THERE'RE WEIRD THINGS IN MOTION
AND CREATURES THAT GLOW IN THE

ELEPHANT

But I feel so pretty.

KINGSNAKE

Does it seem hot to you guys?

(Three MACAWS enter)

MACAW #1

Of COURSE it's hot.

MACAW #2

This is a tropical rainforest.

MACAW #3

We're Macaws.

BEETLE

You look like parrots.

MACAW #1

We are! We're one of hundreds of different kinds of parrots.

MACAW #2

Rainforests are home to more than half of all living plant and animal species.

KINGSNAKE

I'm not sure I'm cut out for all this heat and rain.

MACAW #3

Maybe you belong in a different kind of forest.

MACAW #2

A third of the land is covered with trees.

FORRESTS

DECIDUOUS WHERE THE LEAVES ALL FALL
THERE'S EVERGREEN WHERE THEY DON'T AT ALL.
AND TROPICAL THAT'S SO HOT AND WET
GORILLAS THERE SIT AROUND AND SWEAT.

CONIFEROUS MEANS THEY'RE FILLED WITH CONES SO MANY FORESTS IN SO MANY ZONES.
BUT STILL IT'S TRUE SO YOU MUST ACT FAST THEY'RE DISAPPEARING AND MAY NOT LAST.

FORESTS, ONE THIRD OF THE EARTH FORESTS, YOU KNOW WHAT THEY'RE WORTH FORESTS, THEY'VE SO MUCH TO GIVE

DOO-BOP DOO-BOP-BOP

ALL BUT MACAWS

A GREAT PLACE TO LIVE

MACAWS

DOO-BOP DOO-BOP-BOP

MACAWS

ALL

THE HOME OF SPECIES DIVERSITY

MACAWS

DOO-BOP DOO-BOP-BOP

ALL BUT MACAWS

DOO-BOP DOO-BOP.

BEETLE

I feel at home here. There's rotting fruit all over the ground. I LOVE rotting fruit.

KINGSNAKE

Are you going to stay?

BEETLE

Nah. I'll help you guys find your own biome. Then I'll come back and give it a try.

(THEY start trudging across the stage, towards GRASS that has just entered.)

GRASS #1

Hey, watch where you're walking!

GRASS #2

Show a little respect!

ELEPHANT

I think the grass is talking to us.

GRASS #3

Yes we are. We are the grass of the Serengeti.

GRASS #1

We are part of a savanna or grassland biome that makes up half of Africa.

GRASS #2

You may also have seen our cousins, the tall grasses of the North American prairies.

GRASS #3

Or the short grasses of the Russian steppes.

KINGSNAKE

So you just sit around all day, being, uh, grass?

BEETLE

That must be a sweet life.

GRASS #1

Oh you think so, do you?

GRASS #2

It's no walk in the park.

GRASS #3

We grasses are at the bottom of the food chain.

YOU WANT TO BE GRASS

ALL

OH YEAH OH YEAH UH HUH UH HUH

GRASS

WE'RE EATEN BY THE ANTELOPE FOR ZEBRAS WE'RE A FEAST

ALL BUT GRASS

OH YEAH

GRASS

WE'RE CALLED LUNCH AND DINNER BY THE WILDEBEEST

ALL BUT GRASS

UH-HUH

GRASS WE'RE STOMPED ON BY THE ELEPHANT YOU KNOW WHAT HIPPOS WEIGH?

ALL BUT GRASS

OH YEAH

GRASS
LIONS LYIN' ON US EVERY SINGLE DAY.

ALL

YOU WANT TO BE GRASS?

BE GRASS?

BE GRASS?

SAVANNAS ARE NO PUTTING GREEN

YOU WANT TO BE GRASS?

BE GRASS?

BE GRASS?

OH-WE'RE JUST CUISINE.

ON THE SERENGETI WE'RE THE STEADY FOOD.

ALL

YOU WANT TO BE GRASS?

BE GRASS?

(stunned)

KINGSNAKE

Come on.

(THEY trudge along stage. Three POLAR BEARS enter.)

BEETLE

Man, it's getting cold.

KINGSNAKE

Where'd all the trees go?

POLAR BEAR #1

The *trees* can't *grow*There's *lots* of *snow*But *that's* not *why* we're *feel*ing *low*.

ELEPHANT

I think that Polar Bear just spoke in rhymes.

BEETLE

This must be the Arctic tundra.

KINGSNAKE

Did you say you were feeling low?

POLAR BEAR #2

The tundra's best One big ice chest So that is not why we're depressed.

BEETLE

Are you worried about the melting ice cap?

KINGSNAKE

Is it the short summers?

POLAR BEARS #3

Our words all rhyme It's so sublime But one word kills us every time.

NOTHING RHYMES WITH TUNDRA

IT'S TRUE WE'VE LOST SOME PERMAFROST THE ICE-SHELF 'S GOING BUST AND SUMMER'S GONE JUST TWO MONTHS LONG BUT POLAR BEARS ADJUST.

AND YEAH IT'S TRUE
THE CARIBOU
WILL MIGRATE ONE MORE TIME

BUT HERE IS WHY
I SIT AND CRY:

I was going to eat the grass back there in Africa, but those guys seemed a little annoyed at us already.

(Three GATORS enter)

ALLIGATOR #1

I know JUST THE PLACE for a hungry elephant.

ALLIGATOR #2

Yeah, in my BELLY!

ALLIGATOR #3

No, in MY belly!

(ALL THREE GATORS laugh.)

KINGSNAKE

I HATE alligators.

BEETLE

(jumping in front of ELEPHANT, shouts at GATORS)
You stay away from Elephant!

ALLIGATOR #1

(sarcastic)

Well look at this. Stand back, boys. You don't want to get beaten up by a beetle!

(THEY laugh again.)

BEETLE

I am a Hercules Beetle, the strongest animal on the planet. I can carry 850 times my weight.

ALLIGATOR #2

Which is what, a walnut?

ALLIGATOR #3

Why don't the three of you join us in our swamp?

ALLIGATOR #1

The freshwater biome is the coolest—ponds, lakes, streams, rivers.

ALLIGATOR #2

You'll love it there.

ALLIGATOR #3

As long as you're on top of the food chain—like us!

FOOD CHAIN

WHO EATS ALGAE? WHO EATS MOSS? DOES NOT TASTE LIKE APPLESAUCE. WHO EATS ALGAE? TELL ME WHO— TADPOLES DO. DO DO DO DO DO DO.

WHO EATS TADPOLES? TELL ME WHY? DOES NOT TASTE LIKE APPLE PIE. WHO EATS TADPOLES? TELL ME WHO— INSECTS DO. DO DO DO DO DO DO.

GLAD WE'RE ON TOP.

FOOD CHAIN
THERE'RE NO ABSOLUTES
ONE DAY WE MAY BE SOMEONE'S BOOTS.

UH HUH
UH OH!
YUCK!

BEETLE

(shouts after GATORS, after they're gone)
That's right. I'd run too. 850 times my own weight!

ELEPHANT

(rubbing her stomach)

I wish those alligators hadn't talked so much about eating.

KINGSNAKE

(pointing)

Hey, look under those trees. Mushrooms!

ELEPHANT

I thought mushrooms grew on pizza.

BEETLE

You'd better wait. Some mushrooms are poisonous.

ELEPHANT

How can you tell what kind these are?

(MUSHROOMS jump up and run around, crazy)

MUSHROOM #1

We're WILD mushrooms.

MUSHROOM #2

You don't want to eat us.

ELEPHANT

Yes I do.

MUSHROOM #3

No you don't! We're fungi, and we're decomposers.

MUSHROOM #1

We help recycle dead plants and animals.

MUSHROOM #2

We're very important to the ecosystem.

MUSHROOM #3

Fungi are your friends!

FUNGI ARE YOUR FRIENDS

CACTUS #1

We could use the company!

CACTUS #2

Yeah. Us Cacti can get lonely out here in the Mojave.

CACTUS #3

Hot deserts make up over ten percent of the earth's surface.

ELEPHANT

I need some Gatorade. Aren't you Cacti thirsty?

CACTUS #1

We've adapted to the desert.

ADAPTED TO THE DESERT

IT'S HOT
IT'S DRY
BUT LOOK HOW I
HAVE ADAPTED TO THE DESERT.

THERE'S SUN
THERE'S SAND
AND I GET TANNED
